Endocrine System

1. Definition:

- The endocrine system is a network of glands that produce and release hormones to regulate various bodily functions and maintain homeostasis.

2. Components:

- Glands: Includes pituitary, thyroid, parathyroid, adrenal, pancreas, ovaries, and testes.
- Hormones: Chemical messengers produced by glands, which travel through the bloodstream to target organs.

- Negative feedback loops maintain hormone levels within a narrow range to prevent imbalances.

6. Disorders:

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- Imbalances in hormone levels can lead to various disorders like diabetes, thyroid dysfunction, growth disorders, and reproductive issues.
- Treatment often involves hormone replacement therapy or medications to restore balance.

7. Connections to Other Systems:

- The endocrine system works closely with the nervous system to coordinate bodily functions and responses to internal and external stimuli.
- Hormones can influence immune function, metabolism, and mood.
