Endocrine System

Definition

- The endocrine system is a network of glands that produce and secrete hormones to regulate various bodily functions.

Components of the Endocrine System

1. **Hypothalamus:** Controls the pituitary gland and helps regulate body temperature, hunger, and thirst.
2. **Pituitary Gland:** Often called the "master gland," it produces hormones that control other glands and various bodily functions.
3. **Thyroid Gland:** Produces hormones that regulate metabolism, energy levels, and growth.
4. **Parathyroid Glands:** Regulate calcium levels in the body.
5. **Adrenal Glands:** Produce hormones like cortisol and adrenaline, which help the body respond to stress.
6. **Pancreas:** Produces insulin and glucagon to regulate blood sugar levels.
7. **Ovaries (in females) and Testes (in males):** Produce sex hormones and regulate reproductive functions.

Functions of the Endocrine System

- Maintains fluid balance and blood pressure.
- Regulates reproductive functions.

Hormones

- Chemical messengers produced by endocrine glands.
